NEWS FROM THE MUNICIPALITY

Anaconda Mining Goldboro Gold Project Update

On July 31, 2018, Anaconda Mining Inc. announced the commencement of a 10,000-metre diamond drill program at the Goldboro Gold Project. This new Drill Program follows a highly successful campaign that included 12,231 metres of diamond drilling in 42 holes since May of 2017 when the Company acquired Goldboro. The Initial Drill Program focused on infilling areas of inferred resources as outlined in the 2018 Preliminary Economic Assessment filed on March 2, 2018, as well as expanding the Goldboro Deposit along strike and down plunge and at depth along the host fold structure. Work on this new drill program has started.

"In just over a year of ownership, we have created a tremendous amount of value and we feel we have only scratched the surface. As we grow the resource and move further along in development, we are simultaneously increasing value and decreasing the risk of the project." ~Dustin Angelo, President and CEO, Anaconda Mining Inc.

On August 1, 2018, Anaconda Mining Inc. announced that it has received the permits required to proceed with the extraction of the proposed 10,000-tonne underground bulk sample. In connection with the Bulk Sample, Anaconda has engaged Cementation Canada Inc. ("Cementation") as the mining contractor to assist in the underground development and Bulk Sample extraction. Bulk Sample process is expected to take approximately four months with results to follow thereafter.

"The Bulk Sample is a key milestone in the development of the Goldboro Gold Project, the results of which will enable us to optimize the economics outlined in the Preliminary Economic Assessment, confirm mining and recovery methods and assess the mineral resource around the Bulk Sample. This work will move us closer to demonstrating the feasibility of building a mine at Goldboro. We are also extremely pleased to have Cementation, with its wealth of underground mining knowledge and focus on safety, as a key partner in extracting the Bulk Sample. We believe this has the potential to be a tremendous project for all stakeholders." ~ Dustin Angelo

The Bulk Sample will provide valuable geological, operational and processing information for design and optimization of the overall project in a feasibility study planned to start in September. Bulk Sample activities will involve site preparation, establishment of safe access underground and extraction of the Bulk Sample, which is expected to be approximately 10,000 tonnes. Extraction of the Bulk Sample will utilize the existing decline developed in the late 1980's with minimal development needed to access mineralized zones and planned mining stopes adjacent to existing workings.

On August 7, 2018, Anaconda Mining Inc. registered the Goldboro Gold Project with the Nova Scotia Department of Environment. The Registration is a significant milestone in the continued development of the Goldboro Gold Project which is scheduled to start pre-production in 2020. The Registration document is available for viewing at the Goldboro Interpretation/Community Centre and the MODG office as well as online.

"The filing of the Registration document for the Goldboro Gold Project starts the clock on the permitting process and gets us one step closer to pre-production in 2020. We look forward to working with the Government of Nova Scotia, Mi'kmaq of Nova Scotia, Municipality of the District of Guysborough, and local communities on developing the next gold mine in the Province." ~ Dustin Angelo

Use Of Wipes and Your Septic Tank

Although wipes are great for usage, they do not flush as well as it was once suggested. Many of the wipes even tout the name “flushable” or “disposable,” which gives a lot of people the thought that they can be flushed down the toilet.

Flushing wipes have caused many clogs and the problem is only getting worse. Wipes state that they can be flushed, but the fact is that they don't biodegrade very quickly, and it eventually gets stuck down the drain somewhere, which can cause a [massive clog](#) that may cost a lot of money.

Baby wipes and other personal care wipes do not break up in a sewer system or a septic system. In fact, flushing chemicals, wipes, or other items into your septic tank can cause the waste eating bacteria to die, costing you expensive repairs of your septic system. **Getting your septic tank inspected & pumped regularly is a must if you plan on using wipes.** Wipes and other Debris become caught and form together into one, singular mass until a clog occurs. As more wipes accumulate, it becomes more difficult for sewage to reach processing plants, and becomes easier for a sewage backup to occur, and even enter into your home.

Pumps in sewer, and certain septic systems will be clogged by wipes and other debris. Again, needing expensive repairs costing your tax dollars, or repair costs for personal septic systems. By flushing wipes you could not only look at paying for septic and sewer, but even pay for expensive plumbing repairs depending on the severity of the issue.

To be completely safe, flush only toilet paper.

1) Confidentiality

Complainants' names will be kept confidential insofar as reasonably possible however confidentiality is not guaranteed.

2) Responsibility of Property Owners

The *Municipal Government Act*, S.N.S. 1998, c.18 as am. states as follows:

s. 344 Every property in a municipality shall be maintained so as not to be dangerous or unsightly.

3) Definition

The *Municipal Government Act* defines "dangerous or unsightly" as follows:

s.3(r) "dangerous or unsightly" means partly demolished, decayed, deteriorated or in a state of disrepair so as to be dangerous, unsightly or unhealthy and includes property containing

- (i) ashes, junk, cleanings of yards or other rubbish or refuse or a derelict vehicle, vessel, item of equipment or machinery, or bodies of these or parts thereof,
- (ii) an accumulation of wood shavings, paper, sawdust, dry and inflammable grass or weeds or other combustible material, or
- (iii) any other thing that is dangerous, unsightly, unhealthy or offensive to a person, and includes property, a building or structure
- (iv) that is in a ruinous or dilapidated condition,
- (v) the condition of which seriously depreciates the value of land or buildings in the vicinity,
- (vi) that is in such a state of non-repair as to be no longer suitable for human habitation or business purposes,
- (vii) that is an allurement to children who may play there to their danger,
- (viii) constituting a hazard to the health or safety of the public,
- (ix) that is unsightly in relation to neighbouring properties because the exterior finish of the building or structure or the landscaping is not maintained,
- (x) that is a fire hazard to itself or to surrounding lands or buildings, or
- (xi) that has been excavated or had fill placed on it in a manner that results in a hazard;
