### From The Warden's Desk

"Finally, Summer is almost here!"

With the days getting warmer and Summer fast approaching I am sure we are all looking forward to the many festivals and events held throughout the Municipality over the coming months.

The Municipality is currently in the process of hiring summer staff for various departments such as Recreation, Public Works and the Waste Management Facility. With all of the recreation programming, in-kind contributions to community groups and events, municipal parks and playgrounds, etc. it is certainly a very busy season for everyone.

In March the Municipality adopted the 2017/2018 Budget and I am very pleased that we were able to maintain the tax rates for this fiscal year. The rates have remained unchanged since 2011. We have been able to do this without compromising service delivery to our residents and plan to carry out several new exciting projects this year. The Municipality still has the lowest residential tax rate in the Province of Nova Scotia.

Over the last number of months, the Municipality has continued to work with potential developers to build on our business opportunities to help improve our long term financial health with over 64% of our revenue coming from other sources mostly made up from our business investments.



With respect to our economic development projects, progress continues to be made on the Melford Atlantic Gateway project, Goldboro LNG and the Black Point Quarry Project. Council continues to be very optimistic the 2017/2018 fiscal year will see some of these projects moving forward and making their final investment decision.

The proposed Maritime Launch Services project has made significant advancement. They are proposing to construct a rocket launch facility in the Canso/Hazel Hill/Little Dover area. This proposed project involves launching satellites into space and consists of a Command Centre, launch vehicle facility and launch pad. It is estimated that this facility will cost in the vicinity of \$100 million. Open House meetings have already been held in Canso and Council and Staff have been spending significant time over the past few months learning more about this project and monitoring its' progress. Meetings with Council and the Province continue.

We are also encouraged to see renewed interest in gold mining. Anaconda is in the process of finalizing the purchase of Orex property in Goldboro. In the coming months we expect Anaconda will be forming a Community Liaison Committee and engaging directly with the community in terms of their plans. Preliminary environmental assessment work is already underway. Anaconda will be developing a mine plan and filing its Environmental Assessment documents.

The Municipality is now well into our second year of operations at the Sable Wind Farm. To date, we have exceeded all projections. The wind resource is excellent and the turbines are operating well. Our Small Wind ComFIT turbines in Melford and Goldboro are also generating well and complement our investment in "largewind". We continue to monitor potential for further wind development in MODG and have promoted the Melford area as a potential site for a large-scale windfarm to supply the Atlantic Link Project. Given the tight timelines associated with this project, we may not participate in this round of project development, however we are well positioned for future developments.



### From The Warden's Desk

The Municipality continues to work with developers on the following LNG/Pipeline projects:

- · Goldboro LNG Goldboro LNG continues to make significant progress, having recently reached agreement on Labour the proponents are now in the process of completing a reverse-takeover of Quebec based Petrolia. Through this agreement, Goldboro LNG hope to complete financing to move the project forward.
- · Bear Head LNG/Bear Paw Pipeline Bear Paw has recently executed an option agreement with the Municipality on property within the Goldboro Industrial Park. Representatives continue to have discussions with landowners along the proposed pipeline corridor from Goldboro to the Strait of Canso.

Consultants are continuing to work on the Municipality's new five (5) year Strategic Plan. The Stakeholder sessions have been completed and a Public Open House will be scheduled in the coming weeks which will provide opportunity for public input. More information will be provided once the date has been established for the public session.

The Façade Program will be reoffered in 2017/2018. This is a program wherein Council have provided support to local businesses by contributing financially to assist in improving the "curb-appeal" of those businesses. These projects have included contributions that assisted with upgrades ranging from new signage to complete renovations of buildings. The MODG contribution represents 50% of project costs to a maximum of \$5,000. The deadline for applications for this year will be June 30<sup>th</sup>.

The Municipality was very pleased to receive funding from the Provincial and Federal Government in the total amount of \$3 million for the Chedabucto Lifestyle Complex. The Municipality has awarded the tender for this project to Marco Maritime Ltd. and construction is underway. We are very excited to finally see this project move forward after more than 10 years of planning.

The dissolution of the Town of Mulgrave is no longer proceeding. The Town of Mulgrave recently withdrew their application to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board to dissolve and join MODG. As such, the Municipality has closed this file.

The Municipality recently approved a financial commitment to the St. Martha's Regional Hospital Foundation in the amount of \$250,000 to assist with their goal of building an "Endowment Fund" for our regional hospital. The Municipality will also be lobbying the Provincial Government for representation on the Provincial Health Board. Council is very concerned over the fact that currently there is no seat on the Board for our region.

The Municipality was very pleased to approve 19 applications under the "Green Fund" Program this year. This program provides funding to groups or organizations to assist with activities or projects which are intended to improve the environment or enhance the nature of an area.

The PACE program is being offered again this year and will be providing residents with low interest loans up to \$10,000 to complete energy efficiency upgrades to their homes. To date the Municipality has received six (6) applications under the program.

On behalf of Council, I would like to thank the residents for all of their support and feedback over the last several months and hope you have a great Summer!

### Chedabucto Place Association Grant

MODG has approved a grant of \$2000.00 to the Chedabucto Place Association that will be used to support "not for profit" MODG community groups in accessing the Chedabucto Place Performance Centre to stage fundraising events.

Each qualifying community group will be allowed to access this funding opportunity once per fiscal year. The amount of the funding is \$300.00 per event. This grant will allow the community group to keep all the revenue from paid admissions. This would be of benefit to both the Chedabucto Place Association and the community group. The grant would be made to the Chedabucto Place Association and administered by Chedabucto Place Association. ### LOW INCOME TAX EXEMPTION

The Municipality of the District of Guysborough is accepting applications for the Low Income Tax Exemption for the 2017/2018 fiscal year.

Application forms are available at the Municipality by calling 533-3705 extension 229 or on our website **www.modg.ca**. The application can be found in this newsletter.

All applications for the Low Income Tax Exemption are required to have a copy of their **Canada Customs and Revenue Agency's Notice of Assessment (Year 2016)** and a completed application form signed by the property owner(s). Eligibility for the Low Income Tax Exemption is restricted to homeowners whose **combined household income** is **\$25,000.00** or less per year. Actual taxes or \$100.00 is applied to your account or a refund if account is paid in full.

In order to qualify for this exemption, previous year (2016/2017) taxes must be paid in full or if there is an outstanding tax balance, a repayment schedule must be set up and followed with the municipal office. Applications for the low income tax will be received up to <u>July 31, 2017</u>. Please call 533-3705 extension 229 for a copy of the application.

IT SHALL BE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE APPLICANT TO APPLY FOR THE TAX EXEMPTION.

- 4) Applications must be received by the Municipality of the District of Guysborough on or before <u>July 31, 2017</u>.
- 5) Applications must include **Notice of Assessment(s)** from **Canada Revenue Agency** (CRA) **for the 2016 tax year** for **ALL** members residing in same household, including spouse, common law partner and other person (not including students).
- 6) Please return all applications to the following address:

- 7) Previous year (2016/2017) taxes must be paid in full.
- 8) If a repayment schedule has previously been approved, terms of the agreement must be adhered to over the past 12 months to be eligible.
- 9) If you require further assistance please call the tax office at 902-533-3705 (ext. 229)
- This is an Exemption for taxes for the year 2017/2018 for property taxes only. The exemption does not apply to area(s) rates (ie: fire levies, street light levies, sewer operating etc.)
- 11) The tax exemption will be the lesser of:
  - a) Actual taxes or \$100 if total income is \$25,000 or less

### PACE Program

The Municipality of the District of Guysborough (MODG) has partnered with Efficiency Nova Scotia (ENS) to offer a PACE Program for homeowners.

### PACE is an acronym for "Property Assessed Clean Energy.

It is an innovative municipal financing tool which allows homeowners to invest in long term energy efficiency upgrades to their home and pay for the cost over time through a property tax assessment. The loan is designed to stay with the home rather than the homeowner. PACE allows homeowners to obtain and repay energy efficiency loans through their property taxes. On the sale of the home, the loan stays with the home rather than the seller. Residents of the MODG can borrow up to a maximum of \$10,000 to help cover costs of energy efficiency upgrades.

### To be eligible you must:

- · Own your home you are living in or receive consent to participate from the owner
- Receive consent from all individuals named on the title to the property to participate in the program
- · Be in good standing with all municipal accounts
- · Receive consent from your mortgage lender (if applicable)
- Complete energy efficiency upgrades that will help you save more or equal to the annual payment to the Municipality

### **Loan Details:**

- · Homeowners may borrow up to \$10,000 for up to a 10 year term
- · Homeowners will be charged an administration fee of \$199 to participate in the program and an annual interest rate of prime +1% (currently 3.7%)

### **Pace Program Continued**

### **Steps:**

- Submit the Registration Form to your municipal office for review.
- · Contact your mortgage holder to obtain Lender Consent if you currently have a mortgage on your property.
- Once your Registration Form has been received and approved by the Municipality, you will be contacted by Efficiency NS to set up an initial Home Energy Assessment.
- · After your initial Home Energy Assessment, decide what upgrades you would like to complete and obtain quotes.
- Submit the quotes and schedule a final Home Energy Assessment.
- After the upgrades are verified, your contractor will be paid and you will begin making monthly payments to the Municipality.



This year's Festival will celebrate **Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Confederation.** We will focus on historic information that helped shape us as a people, region, province and country. The traits of Captain Savalette, and our Acadian ancestors helped our region overcome prejudices and evolve into an open and accepting society that we are proud to call "home".

Our annual event will feature the relocation of the "Place Savalette" site from its present location between Charlos Cove and Cole Harbour, to Port Felix. 


